

**MEETINGS**: Meetings are held at the Broadneck library from 7-9 the first Thursday of the month. All are welcome.

A Goshen Farm Preservation Society membership is required to rent a plot, this ensures you are covered by their insurance. If you are not a member you will find a membership form at the bottom.

**PUBLICITY AND EVENTS:** The Garden shower party will take place Saturday, March 31. We will use this event to inform the public and ask for donations of funds or tools for the garden. This event will also be the opening of the plots. Interested gardeners will be able to sign-up and reserve their plot.

**TOOLS AND SHED:** The Shed will be started in June. Until the we will have to store tools in the white building adjacent to the garden. This also has a combination lock with the same combination as the driveway gate.

### **GARDEN DESIGN AND LAYOUT:**

- Are there ideas or plan suggestions for pathways, (wood chips, keep grass) Roy obtained some geotextile fabric to lay down.
- Need to look in to renting a rototiller to till rented plots after opening.
- Terry Brandon has a pumpkin patch plan and the GFPS board liked the idea. I am more than happy to work with him to make it happen.
- There is interest from other schools and organizations (Chesapeake Montessori School) what is the best way to safely cover everyone with insurance but also make it amicable for them to join?

**WATER:** The well works but only pumps 3 gallons a minute. This might not be enough water for all gardeners all summer long. We will need to supplement this and have alternatives.

## **GENERAL:**

- 19 plots are rented and paid for, 14 more plots have been spoken for, 20 plots are available
- Any interest in help pressure washing and pain the new fence.
- Anyone interested in soliciting donations.
- As tools come into the garden we will need to label them with bright green or orange paint.
- Needed before 4/1- A log in sheet for volunteer hours (kept in sleeve with pen at board), and artifact bags for each plot renter and artifact collection bin to be kept in container

### FINANCIAL REQUESTS:

A. I propose the one day rental of a rototiller to turn up the rented plots after April 1. This is in the rules and guidelines of the garden for the first year. United Rentals \$50/day for a 5 horse power rototiller. If rented on a Friday after 12 and returned by Monday before 9am it is a one day charge.

B. Supplemental water will be needed for the garden. I propose containers/holding tanks to store 500-1500 gallons of water (based on a garden's need of 1-2 inches of water per week and 54 plots). Our hope is that most of this water will be collected from rain off the roof of the house or filled by the VFD. A new 1500 gallon container runs \$700. Some are available on craigslist for less. 50 gallon rain barrels are \$10 each from a Pepsi bottling company. Another option is a Metal Farm swimming pool with a cover for \$400. A pump will also be needed for getting the water to the garden is approximately \$200 new, or less from craigslist.

The garden has raised a substantial amount of awareness of the GFPS and its mission. 18 new GFPS members have joined bringing in approximately \$360. When all 23 plots are rented the garden will have \$495. As more plots are rented and members sign up more money will be made.

These are one time costs to get the garden up and running.

### **FUNDS:**

I had T-shirts made for the garden, they will sell for \$15. Any money made on the sale of these will go to the garden.

To continually improve the garden we will need someone to search out grants, and develop fund raisers. The following links are grants and funding for community gardens.
