## Completed prior to the August 10<sup>th</sup> Board meeting

1. Working through permitting issues with the BOE for the cottage.

- 2. Meeting set for August 12<sup>th</sup> at cottage with Greg Stewart the Senior Manager of Engineering for AACPS.
